Coronavirus and Young People

The Coronavirus pandemic has had a big impact on the economy, and employment opportunities will be affected for some time to come, some industries will change forever with many people being able to work from home and remotely using various technologies.

There has been lots of research and reports in recent months which suggests that unemployment will rise across the UK and young people in particular will find it harder to get a job. However, whilst the country gets back on its feet, there is help and support out there. Don't be afraid to apply for all sorts of jobs and training; they will give you valuable experience and help to define what you are good at and what future career pathways are open to you. You can also use this time to do some learning, either at a college or by completing one of the many short courses on offer online. The more skills and qualifications you have, the more likely you are to get and keep a job in the future.

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are a form of employment that is supported by training and assessment, and often leads to nationally recognised qualifications; helping apprentices progress in their careers.

The Coronavirus pandemic has had an impact on the number of apprenticeships currently available due to the restrictions placed on each sector, such as retail. [Find an Apprenticeship](#) is the national apprenticeship vacancy platform but you can also look on local employer websites to learn about their apprenticeships and early careers programmes.

Employers recruiting now include Hays Travel, Busy Bees Childcare, Kwik-Fit, Tiger Martial Arts, Carbon ThreeSixty and Persimmon Homes. Keep an eye on the vacancies over the coming weeks as lockdown restrictions are lifted as employers start recruiting again.
